Community Defibrillator : The following are now in the box that contains the defibrillator:-

1. Paediatric pads. These should be used for children up to the age of 8 or 25kgs/55lbs. These pads should be used instead of adult pads. They should be placed on the child's chest - top right and bottom left *before* they are plugged in to the defibrillator. The plugs are colour coded. Over 8 years/25kgs/55lbs the adult pads should be used.
2. Utility purse. This contains a pair of safety scissors for cutting clothing and/or the bag containing the paediatric pads. There is also a razor for shaving hairy chests so the pads stick on, two wipes and a mask for resuscitation if you prefer not to do mouth-to-mouth. There is also a photocopy of the instructions for the paediatric pads - but you shouldn't need it. More info : Duncan Baker 01588 680123
